Homework

Children will be expected to continue to learn their spellings at home in preparation for the test on Friday. Each Friday, children will be given a spelling sheet to take home with ten words to practice five times during the week. Please encourage your child to practice and support them in their learning. Just five minutes daily practice will help your child greatly. Completed spelling sheets can be returned to school to earn a 'Star for the Jar'.

Reading

Children are expected to bring in their reading book **every day** and change their book when needed. Reading at home will be logged on the digital reading platform 'Learning with Parents' and they will be expected to read at least **3 times** that week at home. For every 50 reads they achieve this year, they will visit our book shop and choose a book to take home. Children will be given plenty of additional opportunities to read including: shared reading, independent reading, reading for pleasure, story time and reading to a buddy.
