


Y6 Residential to Parson House


Sheep Dip Lane Academy

Year 4 - African Creativity!





Careers Week

Earlier this term, we were so proud of our year 3 children who used their Resilience and Collaboration skills to rehearse and perform a Roman play, directed by our school's Drama Teacher, Kevin Spence. Working with Mr Spence our drama teacher has really helped to develop their knowledge of Ancient Rome and the invasion of Britain as part of their History lessons about The Romans.
