<p>Resources purchased to ensure lessons can be taught to a high standard.</p> <p>Attended various tournaments and won one specifically targeted for SEND pupils (Boccia) and tag rugby. Pupils had the experience of attending the Institute of Sport for the finals. For our pupils who took part in the tag rugby finals, they had the opportunity to attend the Rugby League World Cup and engaged parents in this event. The children also played tag rugby on the Doncaster Rovers ground before the tournament and were flag bearers.</p> <p>New sports ambassadors introduced to Key Stage Two to promote PE, capture pupil voice and support at extracurricular activities.</p> <p>Post covid we are now offering a wider range of sporting extra curriculum – football, girls football, tag rugby and dodgeball.</p> <p>Year 5 trained as playground leaders and arranging a variety of activities to ensure more children are active at break and lunchtimes.</p> <p>Fully embedded the scheme of learning for PE across the academy with clear assessment indicators for staff. 


